THE ORIGINS OF LAG BAOMER

Rabbi Akiva (d. 135 CE) was a one of the greatest Torah scholars who ever lived. He grew up poor, humble, and illiterate, and it wasn't until his wife Rachel urged him at age 40 to go study that he began learning from *aleph*, the very beginning. After 12 years of intense study, Rabbi Akiva returned home to his wife only to get her permission to go back for another 12 years of study. When he returned home again, he had amassed 12,000 pairs of disciples.

But, teaches the Talmud, all 24,000 of his disciples died during the seven weeks between Passover and Shavuot because they did not treat one another with respect. This is one of the reasons why the period in which we count the Omer (between the freedom of Passover and the giving of the Torah on Mt. Sinai on Shavuot) is a period of semi-mourning.

However, the plague that took the lives of Rabbi Akiva's disciples is said to have let up on the 33rd day of the counting of the Omer— ל״ג (lamed-gimel) in gematria, the system of assigning numerical value to each letter of the Hebrew alphabet. And so, ג"ג נעומר (Lag BaOmer) became a day of celebration and joy instead of lamenting and gloom. Another legend about Rabbi Akiva says that it was on Lag BaOmer that he chose to defy the Roman authorities, sneaking his students into the wilderness to study Torah despite a decree against practicing Judaism openly. To throw off the Romans, Rabbi Akiva instructed his disciples to bring with them a bow and arrow to make it look as if they were merely going hunting. Those who avoid cutting their hair as a sign of mourning get a haircut on Lag BaOmer, weddings are held, bonfires are lit, and communities join outside in beautiful mid-Spring to sing and enjoy one another's company. Alternative origin stories for Lag BaOmer abound, including those that relate to Rabbi Simon bar Yochai, one of Rabbi Akiva's few disciples of who survived.

As we did last year, we will celebrate Lag BaOmer at Temple Beth Am with a fire pit, singing, lawn games, and a bring your own picnic dinner. This year, we will also learn together about Rabbi Shimon Bar Yochai and his connection to Lag BaOmer. The 33rd day of the Omer begins on the evening of **May 8th** this year; we invite you to join us at **6pm** in TBA's Gan Ha'Am as we celebrate this special day with our community.

Celebrating Shavuot, Torah, and a Year of Learning in Religious School at TBA

On the evening of Thursday, May 25, Temple Beth Am, as part of a communal MetroWest multi-synagogue collaboration, will celebrate Shavuot. Shavuot celebrates the Jewish people's receiving the Torah on Mount Sinai, and that unforgettable, intimate experience with the Divine, the voice of G-d heard in fire and smoke from atop the Mount Sinai. There is a tradition to study Torah all night (or late into the evening) on the eve of Shavuot, and to rise early the next morning, to hear the 10 commandments chanted from the Torah.

As we celebrate the giving of the Torah on Shavuot, we also celebrate the learning

that is essential to Judaism, and the Torah as its ultimate source. This month, as we conclude a year of learning in the TBA religious school, we celebrate our religious school students' commitment to learning. **On Friday, May 12, at 6:30 PM, we will celebrate Education Shabbat** — a special Shabbat service in which we honor our teachers, *Madrichot*, students, and families, and the wonderful learning they have engaged in this year.

This has been a special year of learning in the Temple Beth Am religious school; we welcomed new, dynamic teachers to our staff, and new families to our Temple and school community. Students attended a Tu Bishvat Seder, learning all about their connection to the land, and eating special foods that grow in Israel. Students celebrated their connection to the land of Israel on Yom HaAtzmaut (Israel Independence Day), taking part in a ceremony, and then a day of Israel-focused games and crafts. A few highlights from individual classes include: creating freedom playlists for Passover, having a mock Passover Seder, our youngest students learning to read Hebrew, and 9 B'nai Mitzvah taking place throughout the year. We are thankful to our wonderful teachers and *Madrichim* for their commitment to our students' Jewish education.

And we recognize the commitment our religious school families have made to the Jewish education of their children.

The Jewish people are sometimes referred to as "עם הספר" (am haSefer), the people of the book. This month, we celebrate our Temple's commitment to Torah and learning with Shavuot and Education Shabbat. But Shavuot also calls on us to consider the moment of revelation, G-d's direct encounter with the Jewish people on Mount Sinai. As spring is upon us, and summer close behind, we can look for moments of revelation in our own lives. When have we felt the presence of G-d? When have we felt especially close to our families, our friends, and our community? When have we experienced personal, spiritual moments? On Shavuot, we relive the original moment of revelation, hearing the 10 commandments chanted from the Torah, and looking for spiritual meaning in our own lives. We hope that you will join us to celebrate Shavuot, as part of a multi-synagogue MetroWest celebration, the evening of Thursday, May 25!
