A word from Rabbi Blumberg

A SHABBAT CHALLENGE



It's felt like some cosmic joke that it's rained every Saturday afternoon over the last few months. So when May 3rd, the day of our Shabbat hike rolled around and the skies were clear, it felt like God Godself was rooting for us.

After meeting in the parking lot of Nobscot Scout Reservation, we introduced ourselves to one another and hit the trail. It was a sacred joy to be in company of community members— both new and

seasoned— as we engaged in conversation and appreciated the beautiful world of Creation around us.

Before we made our way back to the parking lot, we read an excerpt from an article titled “Powering Down” by Jennifer Bleyer from Tablet Magazine, in which she shares her family’s journey of embracing a Shabbat observance that worked for them, most notably powering down devices with a screen. Bleyer reflects on her family’s experience:

"[O]ur greatest enjoyment was simply being suspended in a day of being rather than doing. Piled on the couch together as a family without the distractions of interactive technology, divorced from the acquisitive and aspirational impulses that drive most of modern life, we understood in the most visceral way how the deprivations one enforces on the Sabbath enable a kind of liberation. Our attention was reserved for each other. The world was overlaid with glittery stillness. We stepped back from the buzzing of our lives and said, 'Here we are.'"

At the end of our learning together I issued a challenge: **What would it be like to spend one whole Shabbat— Friday evening to Saturday night— between now and the High Holidays with your devices powered down?** No news, no email, no text messages, no endless scrolling for one day; instead, simply living in to the sublime beauty of the world around you, reserving your attention for those with whom you are sharing actual space and time.

As we prepared to finish our hike, Cantor Wolff encouraged us to focus on one aspect of the natural world around us as he played a sustained tone on his Tibetan singing bowl and led us in singing from Psalm 92:

מִה־גְּדֹלוֹ מַעֲשֵׂיֶיךָ יי; מֵאֵד עֲמֻקּוֹ מִחֲשֻׁבְתֶיךָ

“How great are Your works, God; how very subtle Your designs!”

After a moment of silence, conversation picked up again and we returned to our cars. This time—spent with community, engaged in learning, connecting with nature—was holy.

President's Message

Dear Friends,

This is my last President's Message, and I have struggled to write it. You would think that after having written more than 60 of these, it would come easily, but not so.

It has been an honor to serve as the President of Temple Beth Am, and not just because I am the record-holder for the longest term – 6 years! It was an honor because of all that was accomplished, with the help of so many of you.

Highlights include hiring Rabbi Blumberg and Cantor Wolff with the help of an outstanding search committee, guiding TBA through the Covid epidemic years, renovating major parts of our aging synagogue building, developing a security plan to deal with increasing anti-

Semitism, and many, many etceteras. Highlights must also include the honor of having worked with so many TBA members, both on the Board of Trustees and off, and who are now counted as “friends.”.

It was an honor from a personal standpoint because I never imagined that I would be president of such a wonderful community. I began volunteering at age 8 when my mom chaired the Sisterhood Judaica Shop in our Connecticut synagogue, and I was assigned the task of affixing price tags to the items being sold.

My adult volunteer career began at TBA when I was asked to work on and quickly became the editor of Sisterhood’s Shofar, their own monthly newsletter that is no longer published. A few years went by and I became Sisterhood President, a job shared with Eileen Fox. I was on and off the Temple’s Board of Trustees, and for a while on the Board of Trustees of what is now 2Life communities, and formerly Jewish Community Housing for the Elderly. I also served on the Board of Women for Reform Judaism, eventually as President of District #1.

And I am not done! I intend to be involved at TBA as Immediate Past President and Chair of the Nominating committee in this next term, plus any other tasks that I can assist with long-distance. As many are aware, Alain and I have become Florida residents as he is now teaching at University of Miami. No matter where I am, Temple Beth Am will always be my synagogue community.

Thank you for having given me this opportunity. I hope that the new TBA Board of Trustees, beginning on July 1, will deal wisely and well with their responsibilities. I hope too that our efforts to revitalize our Board succeed and that TBA will be enriched by an influx of new members who will bring their joy of Jewish life to share.

A Note from Cantor Wolff

Celebrating the End of a Year of Learning in the TBA Religious School



We arrived at the last day of lower religious school on Sunday, May 18. We celebrated a wonderful year of learning on this last day – a year of growing our community of young families and children, a year of deep learning, and a year of fun and social connection. All students and teachers gathered for a closing ceremony and service (see photo below). We conducted a *Shacharit* service (morning service), with each grade leading a part of the service. Students shared their favorite activities from this year, as well as things that surprised them in their learning.

A few stand-outs (according to the students) were the Purim puppet show created and performed by Rabbi Blumberg and myself, and students sharing their struggle to learn final letters in Hebrew (they can be confusing!). Holding this year of learning and Jewish community in our minds and hearts, our students and teachers thanked G-d for allowing us to arrive at the last day of school, by singing the *Shehecheyanu* blessing together. That same weekend we celebrated “Education Shabbat”, a special Shabbat service during which we honored and blessed our amazing TBA teachers and staff. Below are a few additional highlights from our year of learning and fun this year in the TBA religious school!

Our large class of K-2 students worked hard all year learning their Hebrew letters and learning about the Jewish holidays. Pictured below is our K-2 class enjoying a mock Passover Seder; some students were even brave enough to try eating *Maror* (horseradish)! Our 3rd-4th grade class worked hard learning their *tefilot* (prayers) this year and had fun creating their own Purim spiel. Our 5th-6th grade class learned some modern Hebrew vocabulary and kept a year-long journal of all the words they had learned. And our 7th grade class learned about the modern state of Israel, and also did some hands-on learning. Below you can see our 7th graders hand-made Challah!

The pool of Jewish knowledge is so deep; there is always more to know. Jewish education is a lifelong pursuit. After their B’nai Mitzvah, our 7th graders are invited to join our upper school program. After graduation and confirmation, we stay in touch with our TBA students in college, encouraging them to continue learning and engaging with Judaism. And Jewish learning continues into adulthood at TBA!

As this school year comes to a close, we are already planning for next year. We expect to welcome more new students and families to our religious school and our community next year. We wish all of our students and families a sweet and restful summer. We can't wait to continue learning next fall!




